OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

This telephone does not require batteries or AC adaptor to operate.



“VOLUME PLUS +” FEATURE

Pressing the VOLUME PLUS + button on the keypad increases the handset's Volume Amplifier's receive gain to 27db; this increases the volume range from BOOSTED to SUPER-LOUD. The CLEARING AID tm circuitry automatically varies the frequency response for improved clarity. The volume returns to normal levels when the phone is hung-up.



HANDSET AMPLIFIED VOLUME CONTROL

The rotary volume control on the handset provides continuously adjustable amplified receive volume from NORMAL to LOUD in both SPEAKERPHONE and handset modes.



SPEAKERPHONE

Speakerphones for fully hands free operation press the speakerphone button to begin speakerphone operation, or to disconnect a call when in speakerphone mode. Speakerphone volume is controlled by the rotary volume control in handset. To switch to speakerphone mode from the handset: Press the speakerphone button once and hang up the handset. If you are on speakerphone and want to switch to handset, just pick up the handset at any time.

RECEIVING A CALL

When the phone rings, the large red RINGER light flashes brightly. Pick up the handset or press the speakerphone button and you are automatically connected to the caller.

MAKING A CALL

Pick up the handset or press the speakerphone, listen for dial tone, then press the keypad to dial the number you wish to call.

ENDING A CALL

Place the handset back in the cradle to end your call. If you are in the speakerphone mode, pressing the speakerphone button will end your call.



RINGER LEVEL

The ringer switch is found on the cabinet below the handset.

The volume level can be set to LOW, MEDIUM or HIGH using this slide switch.

The ringer operates on a lower frequency to assist those with typical hi-frequency hearing loss.

When ringer is set at “hi”, it produces a deep tone low pitch sound.

RINGER LIGHT

The ringer light always flashes at full brightness on incoming calls.

HEADSET USAGE

Instructions on how to use a headset for hands free operation:

- 1) Do not remove handset from cradle
- 2) Insert headphone jack into outlet found on the side of telephone
- 3) Press speakerphone button to answer call or to dial a number
- 4) Headset volume is controlled by volume control in handset
- 5) To disconnect call press speakerphone button

This telephone is compatible with headsets for Motorola and similar mobile phones.

DATA PORT JACK

The data port jack is found on the right hand side of the telephone.

FLASH BUTTON

The flash button is found on top of the handset cradle.

This button can be used for call waiting pause or to place a new call.

KEYPAD

The Day Glo "No Wear" keys are designed for easy maintenance. Never use a wet cloth to clean a telephone.

MUTE BUTTON

Located on the bottom row of keys in telephone base.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Use a damp cloth for cleaning. Do not use aerosol or liquid cleaners as they can damage telephone.

TROUBLE SHOOTING

NO DIAL TONE

Check all connections.

Unplug telephone from wall jack and reinsert.

Check J11 jack for breaks or tears.

Try moving your telephone to another wall jack and plug J11 jack into a new location.

Do not under any circumstances try to unscrew telephone base as this can be hazardous and will void your warranty.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE
